# Top 10 Interview Tips

**1. Be punctual.** If necessary, drive to the interview location the day before to ensure you know how to get there.

**2**. **Prepare for the interview**. Research the company and its products and services, and make sure you know the company's correct name.

**3. Relax and be yourself**. So many times, people stress over a job interview. Your best bet is to be the best, professional version of yourself, and look at an interview as an adventure. You are likely to learn something new and useful, even if you aren't the right person for the job.

**4. Smile and be friendly**. An interview is not the time to be shy. A warm smile goes a long way toward establishing a good first impression and rapport with the interviewer.

5. Use a firm handshake and direct eye contact. A limp handshake or lack of eye contact can make you appear ill-at-ease and possibly less than honest. End the interview by shaking hands with direct eye contact and say "I look forward to working with you" 6. Bring copies of your resume and portfolio. Interviewers don't always have a copy of your resume available and you will seem ultra-prepared if you have extras. A leather portfolio containing samples of your work is also impressive. Of course, the type of job you are applying for dictates what goes in your portfolio. 7. Look the part. You want your potential employer to be able to visualize you in the role. Good grooming and professional appearance are important. Even if you know the office is typically business casual, a wellfitting suit makes an excellent first impression. 8. Ask questions. Make sure you have prepared a few questions ahead of time. Typically, interviewers gauge your interest in the position by whether you ask questions.

**9.** Bring a planner or pad of paper and a pen. This way, you can take notes or even write down your questions if you tend to get nervous.

10. Write a thank-you note. Make sure you get business cards from every person who interviews you and send a handwritten note to each one. Make sure you spell their names correctly. So few people write thankyou notes that this alone will create a positive impression. Be sure to include the following in your thank you note or right after your interview:

I look forward to working with you!

The Work Opportunity Tax Credit (WOTC) is a Federal tax credit available to employers for hiring individuals from certain <u>targeted</u> <u>groups</u> (ex-felon) who have consistently faced significant barriers to employment. A "qualified ex-felon" is a person hired within a year of: Being convicted of a felony or Being released from prison from the felony



# How can I find other companies that hire ex-felons?

## Here's EXACTLY what you need to do -

1. Call ALL (not some, ALL) of the temporary employment agencies in your area. Tell them that you are an employer seeking potential employees. Ask them about their "Screening process."

Some of the employment agencies will say, "We check into a

person's criminal background. Some will say, "We check credit backgrounds, but not criminal" or "We only require applicant to take a physical and drug test." ...You will obtain a myriad of responses.

2. Make a list of all of the employment firms that, using their process, you will PASS their employment screening and always be Honest!

### 3. APPLY TO ALL OF THE AGENCIES on your list.

4. When you get a job, regardless of the pay, work yourself into the ground. Smile, don't complain. Come in early and stay later than required. Develop a GREAT reputation. Very soon, you will be promoted from within and no one has to know about your past.

# Top jobs for Felons

Getting a job with a felony on your record can be very difficult, as you probably already know. Jobs for felons are difficult to get, and most companies won't hire a felon. The ones that do generally don't pay very well. I have compiled a list of the top 10 jobs for felons. Helpful tip: if your felony is over 7 years old, most states don't allow back-ground checks to go back that far. ..so check your state before you answer and ALWAYS be honest!

## Top 10 List -----

#### #10 Job - **UPS Delivery Driver** UPS has been known to hire felons. They have moderate salaries and is a stable job to have.

#9 Job - Join the Merchant Marine They accept people with criminal backgrounds, depending on the crime. Contact a recruiter to see if you qualify to join.

#8 Job - **Truck driver** Many trucking companies are willing to hire felons. Most likely you will need to obtain a trucking license.

#### $\#7\,\text{Job}$ - Start your own business

You can start your own business. One idea is to go to school to be a locksmith, and start your own company. Also consider getting a barber license.

#### #6 Job - Telephone Customer Service

Many companies are willing to hire felons for over the phone customer service, because you aren't dealing with the people in person.

#5 Job - **Temp Agency** Temp agencies can occasionally find good work for you. Many times it will be day labor, so be in good physical shape.

## #4 Job - Family business'

See if you can work in a family or friend's business. They will be happy to hire you if you are willing to work hard. They will probably be glad to help you get back on your feet.

#### #3 Job - Independent Contractor

Independent contractors are also less likely to undergo a background check. When you work as an <u>independent contractor</u>, you are not classed as an employee of that company, so it is less likely the company will feel a responsibility to delve into your past. Delivery people, newspaper delivery, freelancers of any variety and independent salespeople often dodge the bullet when it comes to background checks.

### #2 Job - Privately owned small businesses

Some chain businesses have rules against accepting felons. Small business owners are more likely to accept you. They will take more of a 'risk' in hiring employees, and you can be more personal with the business owner.

### #1 Recommended Job - Online

This is the best job for a felon, because it requires no screenings whether it be background checks, drug tests, etc. Some online jobs can be scams so if they ask for money upfront, don't!
